THE CHALLENGE

In the U.S. alone, women-led companies perform 3X better than the S&P 500 average¹.

Despite this fact, only 2% of venture capital funding goes to female founders² and only 5% of CEOs in the U.S. are women³.

In fact, it is expected to take another 202 years to close the economic gender gap at the current pace⁴.

This is unacceptable.

Exponent was conceived during the G7 Gender Equality Council when Prime Minister Justin Trudeau hosted an intimate meeting with industry leaders. A vocal feminist, Trudeau curated a gender-balanced cabinet, and he challenged the guests to do more to fight for gender equality in business.

Andy Berndt, Malika Saada Saar, and Rebekah E. Dopp, were at that meeting, representing Google. The three were inspired: If Trudeau could have a gender-balanced cabinet, what could the business world be doing to move the needle?

Google's "20% Projects" encourage employees to spend 20% of their time on passion projects. Rebekah created a 20% project called "Google's Gender EQ Project" — which would soon become Exponent.

Today, Exponent exists as an independent, nonprofit corporation. Google was one of our inaugural private sector partners alongside Nasdaq, BBC, and Bloomberg.

Exponent is a coalition of leaders tackling worldwide issues through a gender lens. We believe that through cooperation and maximizing each partner's strengths, we will increase global impact, *exponentially*. Through the Exponent Alliance — composed of private sector pioneers, influential icons, and world-renowned experts — we amplify global gender equity efforts, as well as spark new initiatives that result in exponential change.
